MINUTES

North Ada County Fire & Rescue District Board of Commissioners did conduct a regular Commissioner Meeting at 4:00 p.m., Monday, February 9, 2026. The meeting was available in person and via teleconference and was conducted in compliance with the Idaho Open Meetings Law.

Call To Order: 4:00 p.m.

Commissioner Roll Call: Commissioners Bunderson and Ramey were present.

*** Consideration to Approve Minutes dated January 12, 2026.**

Commissioner Bunderson made motion to approve the minutes dated January 12, 2026. Commissioner Ramey second. No discussion. Roll Call Vote: Bunderson (yes), Ramey (yes). Motion carried.

*** Consideration to Approve the Check List dated February 9, 2026.**

Commissioner Ramey asked DA Vaughan if there is anything remarkable on the check list. DA Vaughan replied that the January Ad Valorem remittance from the County in the amount of \$3,910,889.19 was received and immediately transferred into the Local Government Investment Pool account so that it can begin earning interest for the District. John Blake – Ada County Paramedics Update and Vision for Station 18

Chief Blake stated that Station 18 has been a very good response location for ACP. ACP has had 1 or 2 cars responding out of the station for the past few months depending on their daily staffing capability. In the late spring or early summer an ILS unit will be responding out of Station 18 full-time. The car will be manned by advanced EMT's. Response area and call type are not yet determined. DA Vaughan stated that she will be working with Chief Blake in the near future to complete a rough draft NACFR/ACP co-staffing agreement.

Eagle Fire Department Update – Chief Theron Hudson

Chief Hudson reviewed the Eagle Fire call volume report for station 5. The report shows that 65% of the time Engine 5 responds inside of the NACFR district.

Eagle Fire is now hiring 8 new firefighters and starting a new Academy shortly. EFD is also adding a new position to the Administrative staff.

EFD began construction at the Beacon Light property, and they will be breaking ground on 2 additional station sites in March.

Chief Lewis plans to attend the NACFR Commissioner meeting in March.

Boise Fire Department Update – Chief Romeo Gervais

The Call Volume Report from Boise Fire was distributed to the NACFR Board. No representative from Boise Fire was present.
